- Ardee Community School was established in 1974 as an amalgamation of the three existing Post Primary Schools in the town,
- St. Anne's Secondary School for girls,
- De La Salle Boys' Secondary School and
- Ardee Vocational School.
- The original school premises on the current site was built to cater for the amalgamation.
- New extension opened Sept 2018
- Further extension (Major building project)at design stage.
- Extensive refurbishment and upgrading ongoing
- Playing pitch, walking /jogging track.

Subject Choice

Students choose four option subjects for the three years of Junior Cycle.

How subject choice works

- Parents/Guardians will choose subjects through our administration system.
- Students are placed in options generated by our computerised system.
- There are strict limits to the sizes of classes in practical subjects
- If a subject is oversubscribed, the computer will use random selection to place students in options.
- We allow limited change if there is room in the chosen class.
- Most students get their chosen preferences.

Study a European Language

In First Year students choose between

- French
- German
- Students who are exempt from the study of Irish may be exempt from the study of a Modern Foreign Language.
- Some choose to study a European language in even if they are exempt.
- This is monitored throughout first year.





3 ASD Classes

18 students are supported by 6 SNA's

Admission requirements:

- 1. DSM-V diagnosis
- 2. Report stating that; "the student is entitled to a place in an ASD class within a mainstream Post-Primary School setting"
- 3. Students complex needs are clearly outlined in a report.

Irish Exemptions

CRITERIA

- Education up to the age of 12 outside the state.
- On/Under the 10th percentile in a literacy assessment intervention for 8 weeks - retested.
- Exceptional circumstances 2 Years
- Diplomat/ consular representatives in Ireland

SCHOOL-BASED ASSESSMENT DETERMINES WHETHER AN EXEMPTION IS GRANTED OR NOT.

Assistive Technology

- ➤ Some of our students utilise AT to support their learning and to ensure they can access the curriculum. These may include C-Pens, laptops, speech to text etc
- Assistive technology applications are made through the SENO
- " Essential to access the curriculum " and how the AT will be used throughout the school day.

RACE-Reasonable Accommodation in State Examinations

What is it?

Facilitates access to the Junior/ Senior certificate examinations by candidates who would have difficulty in accessing the examination or communicating what they know to an examiner because of physical, visual, hearing and/or learning difficulty.


- Types of accommodations;

VERY STRICT CRITERIA

Exceptionally Able Students

Identified through the entrance tests, primary school handover and recognised by teachers in classes.

Programme of support built into individual subject plans.

Preparation for First Year

Some suggestions

- Work with your son/daughter on organisation
- Expect high standards from them.
- Have a routine of homework and study from the very beginning.
- Have a regular sleep routine, bedtime routine free of social media, play station, x-box and television

- Know and double check where your child is at all times.
- Encourage them to keep up some of their out of school activities
- Continue to encourage a healthy diet and exercise including breakfast before school.

Admissions Process. What happens now

- Letter of offer and Part two application form by email by Nov 17th 2023.
- Offer of place to be accepted by Friday December 1st 2023 by submitting Application Form Part 2.
- ► A secure password for Vsware (or new system) will issue to all Parents/Guardians
- Subject Choice will be done electronically through Vsware (or other system) in February
- ► Entrance tests Friday 23rd February and Saturday 24th February
- Information on the book scheme, calendar, uniform start date etc will issue in mid June.

Transport

- To qualify >4.8 KM from school
- Apply through Bus Eireann Website under school transport before the end of April. Important Deadline
- Students will be either eligible or concessionary
- ► Eligible means Ardee is your nearest school
- Concessionary means there is a post primary school nearer to you
- Pay or submit up to date medical card details by early June. Important Deadline.
- Bus Eireann offers concessionary travel where there is room on a bus
- Bus Eireann is responsible for school transport, the school has no input
- Tickets are often not issued until late August/early September
